Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back after the summer break and a very special welcome to all our new families, whether you are starting in Reception or in other year groups. As always, it has been a busy summer at Kingslea. For those of you who have been on-site, you will have seen that the well-being walk is complete and the outdoor area between the Year 4 and Year 5 classrooms has been resurfaced. Thank you to Mr Farley for his work on those two projects. We have also painted the Year 1 and Year 2 classrooms. Mr Richmond, our Site Manager, has been very busy refurbishing various rooms and the grounds across the school. I would like to personally thank him and his wife for the pride they take in ensuring that our school looks so welcoming and fresh.

At the end of last week, all the teachers and support staff met for our two INSET days. Every year, schools have five training days to take part in on-the-job training. These days were introduced nationally a few decades ago and were taken from the teachers' holidays, rather than from the children's school days. So please don't think your child is missing school on an INSET day: they aren't. The focus of the training days is for each school to decide. Over our two INSET days we spent time looking at safeguarding, developing whole class feedback, developing resilience in children, the main focus areas for each subject area and how to further improve children's writing.

Whilst the news in the wider world may not as positive as we'd like, here in the world of Kingslea we are very excited about this coming year. We have a fantastic team of teachers and support staff in place, a team that I am very proud of. We have an exciting, relevant and varied curriculum in place, and, as well as aiming to build on the excellent academic results we achieved last year, we aim to develop the children's wider experiences of life. Our club offer continues to be very, very impressive: we will be running almost 30 clubs this term. We also want to continue to work alongside you and involve you in your child's education.

Please remember the bell is rung at 8.40am each morning and this is the time we would like children here for. As soon as your child enters the classroom, the learning starts. If your child arrives at school at 8.50am each day, as oppose to 8.40am then they miss out on almost an hour of learning each week, which equates to 32.5 hours or a weeks worth of learning over the course a school year! Why wouldn't you want your child here for as long as possible!

Medications & Inhalers etc
