

Dear Parents/Carers,

At one of our recent leadership meetings we were discussing our 'curriculum': something that has been a strength of Kingslea since the school opened in 2006. Obviously the curriculum has developed and changed since 2006 in what we teach, the expectations we have, the visits we go on, the standard of work, the progression from Reception to Y6 etc, but the curriculum has always been at the centre of Kingslea's work, even if it wasn't until this September that it became the focus of the government's education policy.

When we talk about curriculum we are not just talking about the subjects we teach: History, Design Technology, Geography, Music, Maths, Physical Education, English, Science, Personal, Social, Health and Economic education, Languages, Art, Religious Education (just in case you weren't sure what the subjects are!). The Kingslea curriculum, and the curriculum in all schools, is about everything that happens in the school day: from arriving at school on time, understanding and following classroom routines and expectations, eating and socialising at lunchtimes, taking part in the wide range of extra curricular activities, learning to be resilient, failing and bouncing back, falling out with friends and making back up, being kind, taking part in new experiences. These are just a few of areas that we consider to be part of our curriculum.



As a school we have a curriculum team—Ms Palmer, Miss Hancock and Mrs Wingfield—and individual subject leaders. The subject leaders develop, monitor learning (through observing lessons, talking to children and looking at work), support teachers, run training for their subject and report back to the curriculum team who ensure that each subject and the wider curriculum (the clubs, the experiences etc.) fit together like a jigsaw.

Hello, I am Alison Wood one of Kingslea's Co-opted Governors. I joined the board in September 2015 and have been Chair of the Curriculum and Standards committee for the last three years. I enjoy being part of the Kingslea community: a caring and inclusive learning environment where everyone is valued and respected. I work alongside the other Governors to support and challenge the school to build on its successes and vision.

The Curriculum committee meets four times a year. During our meetings we listen to a presentation and question Mr Conway and Mrs Payne on the progress and attainment of the pupils in English and Maths. At each meeting, we are kept up-to-date with the curriculum by a member of the school teaching staff. Recently we have heard from Ms Palmer about Kingslea's creative, broad and balanced curriculum. We thoroughly enjoyed looking through Learning Journey books from every year group; all the Governors were impressed with the quality and range of the pupil's work. At meetings as part of the school's review cycle, we receive, discuss and approve policies that are linked to teaching and learning. Recently reviewed policies include Sex Education, SEND, PE and Writing.

I am the Governor responsible for SEND, Pupil Premium and Safeguarding. I meet regularly with Mrs Russell and Mrs Barrett. I have met with children who have told me how they feel safe at Kingslea and I attended a homework club seeing the invaluable support given by the staff who run it. Part of the Governors' responsibility is the monitoring and evaluation of the Pupil Premium expenditure. A recent Local Authority advisor visit reported that Governors were rigorous in their evaluation of effective use of the funding.

Kingslea is a vibrant, caring and nurturing school with high expectations and standards and I am proud to be a member of its community as a Governor.


House Captains

Age ratings are there for a reason and should be adhered to. When we are made aware of children being exposed to these games, we will contact parents and it will be recorded as a safeguarding incident on the child's records. We will then proceed in line with West Sussex Safeguarding Children Board's guidance. Please keep your children safe and follow the guidance.



Harvest

Thank you to everyone for the huge response to our harvest appeal on behalf of Horsham Matters. Revered Natalie and a representative from the foodbank spoke to the children in assembly last week, talking about kindness and explaining what would happen to the donations.
