## Academic Achievement for 2019/2020

We are again very proud of our academic results this year.

- Our end of Reception results show that pupils have made above expected progress from their starting points last September.
- Our Year 1 phonics test results are well above the national average.
- Our Year 2 test results show that the year group have made good progress.
- In the subjects that are tested in Year 6, and can be compared across schools, results are above the 2019 national averages for Maths, Reading, and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling.

We continue to ensure we are a fully inclusive school, including investing time and effort into ensuring all our pupils make above expected progress. Our initial analysis of the data indicates that our children made above expected progress in reading and maths, and expected progress in writing. Whilst our children performed very, very well in the grammar, punctuation and spelling test, there is no progress measure.

It is the consistency of results which show that over the last four years our pupils have made better progress than national in reading, maths, and grammar, punctuation and spelling. It is this consistency that we are very proud of, as our aim is to ensure high academic standards and a wide and varied curriculum day in, day out.
