Science Spotlight Summer 2021

The last few months have been bursting with scientific learning, exploration and discovery here at Kingslea. It's been wonderful to see the children back with their friends, and to feel the tangible excitement in the classroom as they marvel together at the intricacies of the world around them.

In KS1, the children went out and immersed themselves in the spring surroundings, noticing the signs and features of the season. They picked out changes in the plants, weather, sounds (and more), and contrasted them to other times across the year.

Years 2 and 4 have been considering the lives of living things. David Attenborough, Greta Thunberg and many others have shown us recently that the relationship between humans, animals and the world around us is becoming increasingly significant as well as fractious. It has felt very meaningful, then, to consider human impacts on the environment and endangered animals, as well as food chains, sorting animals and more.

Our Year 3s have been classifying rocks, whilst Year 5 have taken their experiments to the kitchen in order to enhance their understanding of materials. It's been similarly hands-on in Year 6, where the world of electricity and circuits have been lighting up their afternoons.

Quad Kids

It has been great to see the children making use of our extensive field, being extremely active and taking part in Quadkids. Quadkids is an athletic competition which consists of 4 events – a sprint, a long distance run, a standing long jump and a mini-vortex throw. Each child, although competing alongside their classmates, has been scored independently.

For KS2, Horsham Sport Services have been running the event during the children's PE lessons and have commented on the great attitude and athleticism of the children. All classes will have completed their session by the end of June if they have not already had their turn

Year 1 & 2 had their contest hosted by the Year 6 PE monitors as will Reception's be in a few weeks' time. All the competing children enjoyed the activities and tried their very best. These events have run smoothly

and been a success due to the patience, kindness and leadership that the Y6 PE monitors show.

Covid

As a school we still have numerous measures in place to limit the impact of COVID-19 including year groups remaining in bubbles, both in classrooms and at playtimes, classrooms being ventilated through windows and doors being left open, air monitors in place and staggered starts at the beginning and end of the school day. KS2 children are also eating outside now when possible.

However we are all aware of the rise in cases nationally.

Please remember that if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 they need stay at home to self-isolate immediately and book a PCR test through https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or by calling 119. The 'at home' Lateral Flow Devices (LFDs) are for asymptomatic people only. Your household needs to isolate too. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

You also need to inform the school office immediately.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19:

- Wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds.
- Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available.
- Wash your hands as soon as you get home.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze.
- Put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards.
- Participate in twice weekly LFD testing following national guidelines (recommended for 11 years and over.)


Notes from the School Office

Hayfever

We are aware that many of our Kingslea pupils suffer with hayfever, and as the pollen levels have been very high recently there have been a lot of itchy eyes and sneezing around the school.

If your child is susceptible to hayfever, please administer preventative medication before they come to school each day. (Priteze is a longer lasting once-a-day remedy than Piriton and there are some good natural remedies available to children).

We are unable to administer any non-prescribed hayfever medication at school, however parents are welcome to come in during lunchtime to give top up doses if required.
