

Dear Parents/Carers,

During half-term I was reading the news and I always enjoy the top ten lists that are produced. I do often wonder about the accuracy of them but all them same they make me think as to whether I would be in agreement. Particular favourites were the best city breaks in Europe—Krakow (agree, a lovely city), most expensive pies at a 2018/19 Premier League football club—Fulham (not been to Fulham since January 1999 so can't comment), the best beach in West Sussex—Pagham (I actually quite like Ferring Beach), the top 10 songs ever—Bohemian Rhapsody - Queen (personally not my favourite but I can see why it made it to the number one position) and then I came across the a top 10 that really caught my eye.

It read 'Real Schools Guide 2019: Every primary school in Sussex rated and ranked'. Well obviously I had to take a look to see how our obsession with the ranking transferred to primary schools. I clicked on the link and there was the top 10, with Kingslea ranked as the number one school in Sussex (both East and West). This was obviously a pleasant surprise.

I then took a look to see what the criteria were. Was it our creative curriculum? The range of clubs? The engagement of our pupils? The sense of community? The hard work of the PTA? The happiness of the children? The quality of our macarena dancing at break-time? Or even the quality of the staff Christmas panto?

No. It was 44 data points and no visit to the school.

Whilst it's lovely that Kingslea is ranked as number one in Sussex, it saddens me that this has been done purely on data, data such as attainment, progress, attendance and staffing ratios. Schools are so much more than data, and whilst we may be the most oversubscribed school in West Sussex, when I ask parents who are looking round for a school place, data hardly enters the conversation. Of course they want their children to be literate and numerate but what comes out time and time again is current Kingslea parents saying to other parents how well their child is doing at Kingslea, the range of

opportunities they have, the fantastic teachers, the strong relationships between parents and staff and how much they are progressing socially and emotionally. Whilst top 10s are of interest you can't judge schools in the same way.

And finally our harvest collection came to a massive 326.20 KG, which equates to 776 meals, which would feed a family of four for approximately 64 days. Thank you to all our families for your donations.


