Christmas Performances



Assemblies

Every Monday we have a whole school assembly for Y1 to Y6 (Reception will be joining us after Easter). We then have a theme for the assembly. Last week's theme was all about politeness. We talk about how you greet someone, saying please and thank you, the etiquette of walking through a doorway at the same time as someone coming the other way, personal hygiene and eating. In other assemblies we've learnt about Guy Fawkes, fireworks and fireworks safety, read the book 'Where the poppies now grow', used Horsham Football Club's draw with Barnsley as an example of doing your best and battling against the odds.

Wellbeing Workshops and Classroom Visits

On Friday 26th January, we will be running a workshop for all year groups looking at 'How to support your child emotionally'. Over the past few years, we have seen a rise in the number of parents asking the school for help, advice and support with home issues, from children saying 'No' to their parent, not going to bed, refusing to eat certain foods to children talking about self-harm and showing significant signs of anxiety. Talking to other schools, it seems that more and more parents are asking schools for help with parenting.

At the workshop, we will be looking at

- What is 'normal' age-appropriate behaviour
- What parenting strategies can be used at home to support the emotional well-being of your child
- Support beyond the home (the graduated response)

Following on from the workshop, you will be able to visit your child/ren in the classroom and take part in a task with them. The session will start at 9.10am and finish at 10.30am (or 10.45am if you'd like to stay for playtime!)

Safeguarding







If you have any concerns about a child, be it in school or out of school, you are able to report your concerns to one of our Designated Safeguarding Leads. These are Mrs Barrett, Mrs Howard and Mrs Payne. You can either approach us directly or ask to speak to us via the office. Whilst something might seem quite minor to you, it could be one piece of information that is part of a bigger picture.

Notes from the School Office

Absences from School

- There are a number of ways to let us know if your child is going to be absent from school due to illness or medical appointment: the absence reporting tool on ParentMail, by emailing office@kingslea.org.uk or by ringing 01403 254282 and leaving a voice message.
- If you inform the class teacher of a child's absence, please also inform the school office. Teachers
 are extremely busy first thing and often the message will not get through to the office team who
 collate the registers.
- If your child is absent and we have not been informed, we will contact parents or anyone else on the child's contact list to find out the reason they are not at school.

It is one of our safeguarding responsibilities to ascertain the whereabouts of any child who has not arrived at school when they are expected.

 School should be notified of any pre-planned absences e.g. holidays, renewal of passport, religious festivals etc. by completing our *Request for Absence form*, available by contacting the School Office.
