

Dear Parents,

As we move into the last four weeks of term, I'd like to say thank you to all of you who attended the Days of Art, supported the scootering days and gave us feedback about how much your child has enjoyed the Lego sessions, Lasertag and about their general excitement around all the other events coming up. We are very much looking forward to seeing you virtually at parents' evenings and in-person sports days.

The extended school day finishes on Thursday 8th July and, for the last two weeks of term, we will continue with the staggered start in the morning and the staggered end of the day. This means for the final fortnight of the school year your child will be finishing at their Monday and Friday time (3:10pm, 3:20pm or 3:30pm) every day of the week. Thank you for your support and positive comments regarding the extended day; it really has had a positive impact on the children's education and has allowed us to include many of the experiences within our full curriculum offer.

Overleaf you can read the staffing changes for next school year, including some sad farewells. Mrs Russell, who is retiring after 42 years of teaching in Horsham, deserves a special mention. Mrs Russell has guided and counselled numerous families, children and teachers in inclusive education, and her kindness and understanding has ensured parents/carers felt heard and valued. The impact of her expertise, knowledge and enthusiasm for supporting children has helped many of them reach their potential and she is now supporting the children of her past pupils, which probably indicates that it's a good time to retire! The Kingslea Primary School community wishes Mrs Russell all the very best for the future. Mrs Barrett has been working alongside Mrs Russell for many years and will be taking over the role.

A number of parents have asked me about September. Our ambition is to return to our usual start times of 8.45am and finish at 3.10pm (Rec), 3.15pm (Y1-2) and 3.20pm (Y3-6). We also aim to return to the option of hot dinners for Y3-6 and clubs across the school. However, this will depend on whether the system for bubbles and contact tracing is still needed when we return in September. Thanks to the systems we have in place, your vigilance and a fair bit of luck, we have not (yet!) had to close down a class or year group bubble. However, every positive case in school has a massive knock-on effect, which leads to significant disruption for education, school and families due to children and staff having to self-isolate.

Whilst we will obviously follow the government guidance in place, I am wondering what alternative options to self-isolation for close contacts of positive cases the government is considering for primary schools like ours. With only four weeks until the end of term, concrete decisions cannot be made regarding September. Therefore, I think that the answer to 'So what's happening in September?' will only be confirmed by the government in August. As soon as we have the guidance, we will adapt our plans and inform you.

Art at Kingslea Spotlight

Art lessons at Kingslea provide children with opportunities to explore a wide range of materials, tools and techniques. Children are given time to practise and experiment and therefore become independent artists with the confidence to try new things.

In Reception, children are given time to craft, paint, draw and build. They have access to materials they may not have experienced before, such as clay. Children are given freedom to investigate and be creative with their ideas. They begin to learn how to use pencils to draw and paint to create pictures. Children have access to a variety of tools and resources to use as they please. In addition to this, teachers carefully plan creative activities, such as observational drawing to link art experiences with what the children are learning about.

In the summer term in Year 1, children enjoy learning about castles. With this comes lots of opportunities to explore print and pattern. Children study the work of Paul Klee to make their own collage. Year 2 look at the beautiful, natural artwork of dyer and embroiderer, Vivien Prideaux. Children develop their printing, tie dying and business (!) skills to create products for their Earth Café! In KS2, Year 3 experiment with a variety of tools, such as sticks, tubes, bones and sponges to create their own cave paintings. Year 4 leap head first into learning about the Ancient Egyptians and make their own wall painting and Year 5 design their own Mola artwork. Further up the school in Year 6, children delve into coastal art and, inspired by artist Gill Williams, create their own piece with a watercolour wash and very careful sketches of a coastal feature.

This term, all year groups take part in a very special art day! This day gives all children the opportunity to engage with different art activities related to their learning journey. The children and teachers are very excited to welcome parents back into school to share this experience!

Notes from the School Office

COVID TESTING

- A big thank you to all the parents who are ensuring PCR tests are taken if a child is displaying COVID symptoms. Remember the rapid lateral flow tests are not designed for use on young children or on anyone showing symptoms. If you are concerned enough to carry out a lateral flow test, you should book a PCR test.
- The Horsham (PCR) Testing Centre is still open and generally results are returned in less than 24 hours meaning most children miss one day of school at most (returning a negative result). This in in comparison with the home testing kits sent through the post which can lead to children missing up to six days of school waiting for results.
