# Well done, we did it!

When we put our minds to something at Kingslea, there's not many that can beat us. You'll be pleased to know that we came first in the Tesco token competition, therefore £4000 is on its way to us. We are hoping to build an outdoor shelter/reading area and install a couple of reading sheds with the money.

### <u>Uniform</u>

# <u>MUGA</u>

We have been given planning permission to build the MUGA on the far car park. There were a number of objections from residents concerned about parents parking across driveways, on pavements etc. This has led to conditions, and a delay, being imposed before we can commence with the MUGA. These include the school having to produce a Travel

Plan to show how we are working to develop alternatives to car usage and decrease traffic issues around the school. Please can we be respectful of residents and access to their properties. It would be a pity if the building of the MUGA was compromised through parents inconsiderate parking. On a related matter central government has given each local authority a pot of 'sugar tax' funding, for projects such as MUGAs. We have put an application into West Sussex and will find out in November whether we have been successful. If our bid is successful, then we hope to astro turf the MUGA.

#### Volunteers meeting

If you would like to volunteer in school on a regular basis we are holding our volunteers meeting on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> September at 9.15am and 2.30pm. It is important that all volunteers, new and experienced attend the meeting. Many of our volunteers spend invaluable time reading with our children, however if you feel you have a skill that would enhance education at Kingslea, for example sewing, IT skills, coaching qualifications please do come and speak to us about voluntary work. ### <u>Car Park</u>

A reminder that there is no parking or movement of vehicles in the school car park at the start and end of the school day. Gates will be closed at 8.20am and re-opened at 9.00am. In the afternoon, the gates will be closed at 2.40pm and will re-open at 3.40pm. Please note these are approximate times. If the gates are open and you park in the car park at these times please do not be offended when you are locked in. At other times, including club pick up, you can park in the school BUT do not block in other cars, including staff cars.

#### Meet the teachers

On Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> September, we would like to invite <u>all</u> parents to come and meet the Y1 to Y6 class teachers. We will be running the meeting twice, at 2.30pm and 6.00pm. For both meetings please enter the school via the office. The meeting will last for approximately 20/30 minutes and you are welcome to take your child home once the afternoon meeting has finished. You are welcome to bring pre-school siblings to the 2.30pm meeting. It is important that every child has a representative at the meeting to ensure all parents are clear about the curriculum, routines, home learning and expectations.

#### **Scooters and Bicycles**

We are delighted that so many children are scooting and cycling to Kingslea. As there are now lots of scooters and bicycles being kept at school each day, please put scooters neatly on the new tarmacked area and bicycles should be locked on the racks at the front of the school (one by the hall and one by the junior entrance).

# Start/end of the day

Please remember that the school gates are open from 8.00am and the bell is rung at 8.45am for children to enter classrooms. Teacher set early morning work from 8.45am and we expect all children to be in class for 8.45am. The gates will be locked at around 8.50am. If you arrive after that time you must enter via the school office, where children will be marked in late. You may also meet a grumpy Mr Conway!! At the end of the day <u>learning</u> finishes at 3.10pm for Reception, 3.15pm for Year 1,2 and 3.20pm for Year 3,4,5,6. Children are dismissed from classrooms once they have packed up and are ready to leave. This will be a few minutes after the stated end of the day time.
