Word	Definition
battlements	A protective, tooth shaped wall with gaps. The raised sections helped to shelter the defenders during an enemy attack.
portcullis	A heavy iron gate that can be lowered to prevent people entering.
turret	A little tower often at the corner of a castle.
keep	The keep is a tall building inside the castle walls, usually a tower. If anyone attacked the castle, people could hide in the keep and stay safe.
drawbridge	A bridge that can move up and down to let people in and out of a castle.

arrow slits	Arrow slits are narrow openings or crosses set inside walls and towers. These allowed defenders to shoot arrows at attackers who were outside the castle walls. A deep wide ditch around the walls of a castle that is usually
	filled with water.
stained glass window	A window made of small pieces of coloured glass which are arranged to form patterns or pictures.
knight	A soldier of the Middle Ages who fought on horseback.
banquet	A formal dinner for many people usually to celebrate a special event.
