#### Dear Parents,

Thank you for your attendance at parents' evening. We hope you found the additional summer meeting useful, and that it allowed you to discuss your child's year and what was written on their report. As a school, we are very pleased with the progress the children have made this year. Where previously the resilience and independence of many pupils had been impacted by Covid and they had become reliant on support for tasks that previously were completed without an adult, there have recently been numerous conversations about the increased maturity of these pupils.

Over the page, you will see the Y6 SATs results. This is something we are obliged to publish by the DfE. They are very strong and the progress these pupils have made is excellent. Whilst we are very pleased with the results, we are also pleased with our children's achievements across the rest of the curriculum and how they have developed as people in the community.

We know how committed, hard working and skilled our teachers and TAs are. Having worked in seven schools with some great people, I know the staff of Kingslea really are in a class of their own. My bottom line has always been 'would I want my own children at Kingslea and taught by these teachers'. The answer is an unwavering 'yes'. If it wouldn't be good enough for my own children, then why would it be good enough for yours? My very public thanks to all our staff.

#### End of Y6 SATS results

At the end of Y6, all children across England take a series of tests in maths, reading and grammar, punctuation spelling (GPS). Writing is also assessed but this is based on the children's work in school and teachers grade the work.

This is the first year since 2019 that the tests have taken place and, unsurprisingly, the percentage of children nationally achieving the expected level has fallen in most subjects. For example in maths in 2019 78% reached the expected standard, but only 71% this year, in writing there was a decreased from 78% to 69% and in GPS from 78% to 72%. Interestingly reading went up from 73% to 74%.

However, at Kingslea, our children have done incredibly well and have outperformed the national averages in all four subject areas, as you can see from the table below.

We put this down to day-in-day high-quality teaching, excellent online Covid provision, the support you give to your child in a typical week and the support you gave to them when school was closed to most pupils.

#### School colours

In assembly last week, we were both excited and proud to hand out School Colours. Colours may be earned when a child represents the school in an interschool competition, festival or performance. There are a variety of opportunities to achieve Colours during a child's time at Kingslea in both KS1 and KS2, including at a range of

sporting events, academic competitions, dance performances and choir, to name a few. Staff will award Colours to children who attend the relevant club, have excellent attendance, show commitment to developing their ability, show exemplary attitude and positivity in the build up to the event, and then finally perform to the best of their ability, whilst demonstrating all the core values of Kingslea at the given event/s. We have updated the colours so that each year group has an allocated colour. Therefore, if you are awarded colours over a number of years, you can watch the rainbow grow as your child progresses through Kingslea. Colours are to be proudly displayed on the sleeve of the Kingslea hoodie and can be ironed on as well as sewn on.



#### Children's Parade

On Sunday 3rd July, Kingslea—along with 16 other local schools—paraded through Horsham as part of the 2022 Children's parade. The theme for this year was the natural world and we were given the role of dung beetles! Prior to the parade, Y2 worked with an artist and used willow to make bodies of the dung beetles, using tissue paper as a covering. On the Sunday, over 40 Kingslea children showed off their outfits to the crowds lining the streets, something that I think the children will remember for a long time to come. A huge amount of work from the Y2 team went into preparing for the event and transporting the children's outfits to the Drill Hall on the Sunday morning and I'd like to thank them for all they did.
