Where would you place this sentence?  I have eaten a meal.	

It is in the past. It is called the **Present Perfect** tense. Confusing!

What do you notice about it?



There are different types of tenses. Here are two of them.

Simple Past	Present Perfect	
I saw a film.	I <mark>have</mark> watch <mark>ed</mark> a film.	
I listened to music.	I have listened to music.	
I drove a car.	I have driven a car.	
I ate a meal.	I <mark>have</mark> eaten a meal.	
I kept warm.	She <mark>has</mark> walk <mark>ed</mark> .	
I talked.	He has made the coffee.	
I swam.	33	

#### Where would you place these?

I swam.

He has made the coffee. I talked. I kept warm.

She has walked.





The present perfect tense uses have + past participle (usually words ending in -ed or -en).

I walked.

I have walked.

Look at more examples below.

#### Present Perfect

They have watched a film.

She has listened to music.

I have driven a car.

We have eaten a meal.

### Which Past?



- Simple past talks about something that started and finished in the past.
- Present perfect talks about something that started in the past but might be true now or affects something that happens today.

I have seen a film.

Present perfect

I saw a film.
