Thank you to all of you who filled out the parental questionnaire at Parents' Evening. As you can see from the table below the feedback was overwhelmingly positive and I feel this reflects the work that we do here at Kingslea and the relationship we have with you, as parents. Added to this we have seen another huge increase in the number of families that have put Kingslea down as their first preference for Reception this September. For the second year running we have the highest number of applications of any school in Horsham. We acknowledge that there are always things we can do to improve and feel that through communication with you and by working together we can all help the school move forward.

As you can see in all cases there has been a marked increase in the % of parents who strongly agree with the above statements. (The figures in brackets are the results from February 2017)

Looking at the comments, the positive comments were very similar in nature with the vast majority focusing on the enthusiastic, caring and energetic staff, the warmth and feel of the school, the quality of leadership, the wide ranging and engaging curriculum, the fantastic array of extra-curricular activities, the inclusive nature of the school, the high expectations that are in place and the regular communication.

There was no particular theme to the areas for development, the ones that were mentioned by a handful of people including parking, quality of lunches, more clubs for younger children and too much information sent out of parentmail.

Regarding parking, parents are very fortunate that they can park in the school car park. I don't know of any other school where this is possible. Parents usually park on roads surrounding the school. We do rely on parents to use common sense when parking, but as Voltaire said 'Common sense is not so common'. Please do park sensibly and safely or we may have to close the car park off to parents.

Regarding clubs, we have run 23 clubs this term. I'm unaware of any other school in the area that runs so many clubs. I agree that it would be lovely to run even more for EYFS/KS1 and that is something we are working on. Unlike other schools all our teachers run clubs and we are fortunate to have a sports coach. Lunches – I, along with a couple of different teachers eat the school lunch each day. We do acknowledge that the 'choice' on offer is limited and not as sold to schools and parents. This is an issue that has been taken up with Chartwells by schools across the county.

The indoor curling tournament required skill and accuracy, both of which Kingslea had in abundance. Children worked with Millais sports leaders to hone their skills before playing against the other schools in teams of two.

Rachael and Orla from Y5 found inspiration from the GB Olympic team and steamed ahead to the semi-finals. In a tense moment Southwater had the board full and everything to lose. Rachael had the deciding throw and with hawk like precision

knocked Southwater's rocks off the board, confirming Kingslea's place in the final. The Kingslea team rallied together to cheer on the pair, (special mention to Isabelle who offered encouragement and tips to her younger counterparts). In the final, the pair came up against some very skilled Year 6 players from Northolmes who just edged to first place. Kingslea once again proved that with teamwork, encouragement and a little inspiration, anything is possible.
