
# Kingslea Primary School N E W S L E T T E R

# **Tesco tokens**

The voting is now open. Please ask for your blue token and put in the collection box token at the Tesco Express on the Kings Road/Redkiln Way roundabout and on Brighton Road (Sliver Wok), and the Tesco Extra at Broadbridge Heath. We are aiming to build an outdoor shelter for pupils to sit under and read during lessons, break and lunchtimes. We have been chosen as one of three causes between  $1^{st}$  May and  $30^{th}$  June 2018 and have applied for £4,000. The project with the highest number of votes will receive £4,000, the second placed project £2,000, and the third placed project £1,000. To vote, you will need to make a purchase in store of any value. You will receive one token per transaction and it's not necessary to purchase a carrier bag in order to receive a token. Please then put it in the Kingslea slot.



# **New House Captains**



#### **Reception Intake September 2018**

Letters have gone out to the new Reception intake for September 2018. We look forward to seeing you and your child on one of the tours. We had a significant increase in the number of parents applying for a place at Kingslea, up from 77 last year to 120 this year, making us by far the most popular school in Horsham, based on parental choice. Over the last few years, non-catchment siblings have secured a place in Reception. This year however, a number of non-catchment sibling children have yet to be offered a place at Kingslea. We are unsure if this is a one off year. If you are thinking of moving out of catchment and you have a pre-school child that you want to attend Kingslea, there is a possibility that they might not be offered a place when the time comes. If you move out of catchment once your child is in school, you obviously can keep your place at the school. If anyone would like to discuss this further please see Mr Conway.

# **Colours**

In assembly we handed out colours for various activities including table tennis, hockey and football. Colours are handed out to children who represent the school events and uphold the values and behaviours that we expect of our pupils; values and behaviours such as fairness, team work, dedication, perseverance and kindness. The final decision regarding the awarding of colours will be taken by myself and the teacher in charge. For sporting events colours are given out at the end of the season and are dependent on the number of events in the competition and how many times the child has represented the school.
