Dear Parents,

Welcome to our first newsletter of the year. It's lovely to see all the children back and I've been very impressed with the wide range of excellent work I am seeing across the school. Reception are so focused and settled, they are particularly enjoying the part-part-whole work and using tens frames in maths. I've been enjoying reading the

writing Year 1 and Year 2 have been producing, particularly the increasing independence of many of the children and their grasp of spellings. Year 3 have produced some high quality painting of Monet's garden which will be up on display later in the term and Year 4 have been researching Anglo-Saxon life and reading the story of Beowulf. Year 5 have been learning about Eric the Red and space exploration and Year 6 have started learning about life in Ancient China.



In the first few assemblies of the term we have talked about what it takes to be in a team, read the story Malala's Magic Pencil and thought about the term 'If it's not excellent, it's not finished'. In the latest assembly I showed the children a few photos of adults who didn't put 100% thought into what they were doing and the subsequent consequences. A couple of examples can be seen on your right. Your children can talk you through the photos.



On a Monday assembly we've introduced 'This week in history'. Every week we look at historical events that occurred during that

week. So far we have had the introduction of the Euro (1999), the opening of the first underground railway (1863) and the unvieling of Concorde (1976).

On a Friday we hold our 'STAR of the WEEK' assembly. One child from each class is chosen to come up to the front of the hall to be presented with their certificate and, if they want to, have a spin on the headteachers chair. Children are chosen for a wide variety of reasons including kindness, teamwork, perseverance and improvement in their work.

Twitter/Facebook

As you are aware we have two school Twitter accounts, one general account and one for sport and PE. We regularly posts news and photos on these sites so you can get a feel for daily life at Kingslea. A number of parents have asked if we can post on Facebook, as Facebook tends to be more widely used by our parent body. We are therefore going to trial using Facebook alongside Twitter. We will be using an app that copies the Twitter posts onto a newly created Kingslea Facebook page. Therefore exactly the same posts will appear on both sites. The new Facebook site will allow more parents to see what we are doing on a day-to-day basis. The Facebook site will not be for parents to communicate with the school; that is still to be done through the usual channels, although positive comments can be left as with Twitter. We have a small number of children whose photos we do not post on Twitter and we will continue with this policy for Facebook. However if there are any other parents who do not want their children's photos on Facebook please let us know.

We will be sending out a separate communication about the above but we thought we would let you know via the newsletter as well.

Playtime snacks

As I'm sure you are aware Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are given fruit at breaktimes. Year 3,4,5 and 6 are encouraged to bring a healthy snack for their breaktime. Whilst the definition of 'healthy' can be varied, the Oxford English dictionary uses it in this example sentence 'stimulates physical and mental performance supplying the body readily usable energy and vitamins.' We would recommend fruits and vegetables, as little packaging as possible, if any, and as unprocessed as possible.



E-safety

It has come to our attention that some parents are giving children unsupervised access to YouTube. Please remember there is a restricted mode that can be used, but children still need supervising when on the internet. Below are some tips on how to help ensure your child's safety online.

How else can I help ensure my child's safety online?

The tips below will help you to set rules for your child about accessing videos on the internet and their online behaviour, and support them to understand the risks and what to do if something happens.

- Try to have your child in the same room as you when they are using the internet, and discourage them from using headphones
- □ Chat to your child about what online videos might not be suitable for them to watch and share
- Regularly check the history of videos they have watched online for anything inappropriate, or create a playlist for them
- Encourage your child to tell you if they see something they find worrying or nasty
- If your child wants to share a video they have recorded, check they get permission from anyone who features in it before they upload it
- Tell your child not to give out any personal information or anything that can identify them, such as a school uniform or street name
- Regularly check comments made on your child's videos. Talk to your child about how they could receive nasty or negative comments from other people, and what they should do if this happens
- If another YouTube user posts a video of your child or shares personal information without consent, you can ask for this content to be removed by using YouTube's privacy complaint process

Notes from the School Office

- Club Attendance If for any reason your child is not able to attend a club they are signed up for, they must inform both the club leader and the office. If we have not been informed you will receive a phone call to check that your child has arrived home safely.
- School Uniform/Lost Property Please, please ensure all uniform and items brought to school are clearly labelled with your child's name. We have 420 water bottles, around 200 lunch boxes, 420 sweatshirts/cardigans and coats coming into school every day. Not to mention PE kits, PE hoodies, shoes etc. If an item is named we can return it to the owner, however without a name it just becomes another item of lost property to be disposed of at the end of term
