Thank you to everyone for completing the parent questionnaire at parents' evening. You can see the results over the page.

Whilst the 'strongly agree' / 'agree' percentages are incredibly high, it is the comments that I find very interesting as they are often insightful, thoughtful and balanced. It is quite refreshing to have a parent body that have high expectations of the school whilst at the same time are supportive and understanding of the context that schools have to work under. For example, the regular changing of Education Ministers (9 since 2014, including one in post for 36 hours!), budgets that in no way reflect actual reality and cuts to services beyond education that schools, families and children rely on.

So in this newsletter I thought I would answer some questions that you may want answers to.

Is Kingslea still oversubscribed?

Yes, although pupil numbers in Horsham have been falling for the last few year, so we envisage that we will take more children from outside of our catchment area in the future.

I understand Kingslea supports other school?

Yes, over the last few years we have supported other schools in developing their early years, their maths curriculum, their wider curriculum, leadership of the school and development of teaching through coaching.

I've been told that the progress children make at Kingslea is amongst the highest in West Sussex.

That's right. Last year our Y6 children made the highest academic progress across reading, writing and maths in West Sussex. Why? Because of the high quality learning year in, year out.

Many schools offer 5 or 6 clubs a week, how does Kingslea offer so many?

Because we have the most amazing team of teachers and support staff that run the clubs.

Why does Kingslea pay for it's own Speech and Language Therapist; shouldn't that be provided by the NHS?

Yes, it should be, but the NHS are unable to recruit SALTs which means our children are missing out on vital, early intervention. We have therefore recruited our own SALT at a significant, but worthwhile cost.

Why does Kingslea pay for it's own Family Worker; shouldn't that be provided by the West Sussex Children's Services?

For many years West Sussex Children's Services have not provided adequate support to children and families, with the threshold for providing support to children and families being very, very high. There is a gap for parent/family support when issues first develop. We have filled this gap and in the last 12 months have supported numerous families with issues around anxiety, sleeping, emotional dysregulation, etc showing that there is a real need for this level of support.

I don't know of any other schools that have an outdoor learning teacher, specialist language teaching (Spanish and Mandarin) and a PE Coach.

We believe that our curriculum should be as engaging and wide ranging as possible and one of the ways to do this is to employ specialist teachers. This costs, but it's absolutely worth it.

I've noticed that many schools have lots of supply/cover teachers. I've not heard of any at Kingslea, why is this?

We have the most amazing team of teachers and support staff. If I teacher needs covering for absence (and our absent rate is way below the national average) or if they are carrying out a leadership role, our teaching assistants cover the class. Our TAs know the children, know the expectations and know the learning, which leads to a better standard of provision than is often the case with supply teachers.

All in all, it is our teachers and support staff that allow us to provide the high standards, wide and varied curriculum and community focus that we are known for.

Sports Update

It has been another busy term for sport, including after school clubs.

One of the first events of the term was Year 2 children taking part in a New Age Kurling Festival. The children loved the new experience of being able to take part in a sporting event, playing against children from other schools. We then turned to the competitive side of sport and our Year 5 & 6 Indoor athletics events. Both teams were brilliant and showed great enthusiasm and encouragement throughout both events. Year 4 had their first taste of a high five netball festival, getting them ready for the competition next year. We've also played in numerous netball and football fixtures. We also entered a Dodgeball tournament for the first time and it was a fantastic learning experience and lots of fun!

We are very proud of our Cross Country teams, with Year 3&4 and Year 5&6 participating in the Horsham wide event at Christ Hospital. Year 3&4 ran 1.2km and every single runner gave it their all. We came second in both the girls' and boys' events and a special mention must go to Finley in Year 4 who won the race and received his first ever 1st place medal. Year 5&6 ran 2km, a longer distance than usual, and each runner ran their hearts out! Kingslea came 4th in both the girls' and boys' events and we had 6 children qualify to represent Horsham at the Sussex Finals.

We do however have to deal with issues regarding children communicating on social media, outside of the school day, and viewing inappropriate content usually without parental knowledge. As much as we try to inform parents about the dangers and addictive nature of what children are accessing on smartphones, in our opinion many parents underestimate the negative impact that the content children are accessing has on their behaviour, enjoyment of other activities and view of the world until it is too late.
