Afternoons - Oktapodi

During the afternoons for your 10 days in quarantine, we would like you to choose some of the activities below. You could complete a different activity each afternoon, you could spend a couple of afternoons doing one activity before choosing another, or you may wish to spend a few days to make an exceptional piece of work. It is completely up to you how you use your afternoons.

Spend some time during your first afternoon watching the video. Then look at some of the activities below and choose which activities you'd like to complete.

<p>Art</p> <p>Design a logo using your name in Greek. Go to this website and type in your name (don't check the box about phonetic Greek). You may need to zoom in to view the Greek in detail at the top. Copy this in large and decorate to make your logo.</p>	<p>D.T.</p> <p>Have a look through these octopus recipes. Which one would you like most and least? Why? Design your own meal with octopus with other flavours that you like. If you don't eat seafood, design a Greek dish to enjoy.</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>See this tourist page about Santorini and make sure you watch the video. Create a leaflet encouraging tourists to visit Santorini when it's safe to do so. What can they see? What can they do? Why should they visit?</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Make your own handprint octopus. Paint one hand and print it onto a piece of paper. Paint your fingers again and add in to make 8 legs under your palm print. Wait for this to dry before adding details like eyes, mouth and suckers.</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>Santorini, where this story is set, is an island which is considered an active volcano. Find out the differences between active, dormant and extinct volcanoes here and then make a poster showing what you have learned.</p>
<p>Art</p> <p>Create a storyboard for the story in the video. Choose the most important scenes and draw them. Add one sentence under each one to show what is happening. Challenge: Draw a storyboard for your own video with different characters based on Oktapodi.</p>	<p>PSHE</p> <p>Read and/or listen to the story of Ollie the Octopus and Sukey the Spider. There are five questions underneath the story which help you to think about the themes of friendship and resilience. Note down your answers to these questions. Challenge: can you write your own poem with a theme?</p>	<p>English</p> <p>The video Oktapodi is created with similar ideas to the Looney Tunes cartoons which are years old. Watch some Looney Tunes videos including this short called Tunnel Vision. Write a reflection explaining which you prefer and why. What features do they both have? How are they different?</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>The video Oktapodi has some traditional Greek music accompanying the story. Watch these two Greek children's songs and enjoy the rhythms and sounds: The Little Crabs / The Dance of the Peas. What do you think might happen in the story about the crabs or the peas?</p>	<p>PSHE</p> <p>One of the octopuses wants to write a valentine's day card to the other. Make a card and write the message inside. It could be a card from any point in the story or afterwards. How would they declare their everlasting love for each other? What image would be on the front?</p>
<p>English</p> <p>What do you think happens next in the story of these two octopuses? Write Oktapodi part 2! Remember to include description as well as action. Challenge: Publish your work and add some illustrations.</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>Find out about Santorini by reading this and this. Create a country file page all about Santorini, including important facts like location, climate, traditions, food, language, history and features.</p>	<p>Languages</p> <p>Can you learn some Greek so that if you go to mainland Greece or a Greek island, you will be able to speak some Greek? Click here to download a poster of the numbers 1 to 20 with the Greek and the pronunciation.</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p>How do the creators build suspense and tension throughout the story? How do the creators make it funny? Write a paragraph answering each of the questions above. Try and give examples from the video to back up your ideas.</p>	<p>P.E.</p> <p>In Greece, one of the main sports played is basketball. Have a look over these activities and complete as many as you can to practise your basketball skills. These are from the Sussex School Games.</p>
