	Pudding Lane	The place where the Great Fire of London started in 1666.
 	bakery	A place where bread and cakes are made and sold. The Great Fire of London started in a bakery.
	baker	A person who works in a bakery to make and sell bread and cakes.
	thatch roof	A roof made from dried plant material such as straw and leaves. It is a very old roofing method, but can still be used today.
	servant	A person who completes jobs for another person, usually in the house such as cleaning and cooking.



soldier

A soldier is a member of the military. They protect the land of a country.



expensive

To cost a lot of money.



hose

A tube used to spray a liquid such as water.



unstoppable

Difficult to stop. The fire was unstoppable as it spread so quickly.



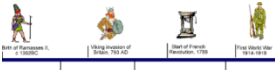
destroy

To damage or ruin something. 13,200 houses were destroyed and damaged during The Great Fire of London.



diary

A book which someone would use to write about their own personal experiences and what has happened to them. Samuel Pepys kept a diary during The Great Fire of London to record the events of the fire.

A timeline is a graph that shows events in order of when they happened.
