The Golden Dragon Bird

According to Japanese tradition the people of the city of Kyoto were once menaced by a huge white dragon. It lived nearby in a murky dark lake. Mysteriously the dragon only sometimes rose to the surface of the lake when the weather was fine, but it did not stay for long. However every 50 years the dragon would change shape sprout yellow feathers and grow much larger. Amazingly it would look like a giant bird! The Japanese called it the Golden Bird, or O-gon-cho.
