

Reading

Activity: Focus on the book you are reading. In your personal writing books, create a new character for the story. Write a physical description, a character description (think about their personality) and then explain what role they would play in the book. It might be a small role, or you may want them to play a big part – it's up to you. Feel free to add a drawing of your new character as well.

We are thrilled that so many children are reading a range of books and we love hearing about what you are reading! Keep reading 5x weekly and updating your reading journals when possible. If you would like an extra written task this week, you could write a new chapter for your book.

Writing/English

Activity: This week your writing is going to carry an RE focus. In the Autumn Term, you learned about different aspects of Islam, which involved a fascinating visit to a mosque. Over the next few days, you are going to consider Christians' commitment to God and the role that church plays in their lives.

Your task (**Monday-Wednesday**): The council is hoping to have a local church turned into a block of flats. Write a letter to the council, persuading them to stop their efforts and to leave the church as it is.

Start by researching churches and the reason they are such special places for Christians. Follow the links to watch the videos and take notes in your books. These will help you when you write your letter.

Add to your notes any of your own or your parents' knowledge on why church is important for Christians.

Once you've researched, you are ready to write the letter. Write an introduction explaining why you're writing. Then write two main paragraphs, explaining, in detail, why the church is too special for Christians for it to be knocked down. Finish with a concluding paragraph, summarising your points.

Persuasive writing checklist: facts, strong adjectives, emotive language, exaggeration, rhetorical questions, personal pronouns, conjunctions.


Maths

Activity: This week we will be focussing on fractions.

Investigation (**Tuesday and Wednesday**): Please choose and complete either the *medium* or *hot* investigation. If you're feeling confident, go for the *hot*. If you start the *medium* and finish quickly or feel you'd rather move onto the *hot*, that's fine.

Follow the usual investigation layout we would use in class, splitting your page into 'My Maths' and 'My Reasoning', as shown in the example (**see attached PDF**).

Medium: How many equivalent fractions can you see in this picture?



When finished, draw a window split into 9 equal sections. Are there more or less equivalent fractions? How do you know?

Hot: You have been given the following digits: 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9

Your task is to create the maximum number of fractions equivalent to $\frac{1}{4}$ as possible. You may use each digit a maximum of 2 times.

You can use the digits as either the numerator or the denominator and can combine digits. So you could have $\frac{15}{60}$, for example.

This is an investigation so we expect you to go into detail and explore as much as you can. Aim for 2 pages of work over the 2 days.
