Writing

Think back to last week's work on The Jungle Book. You chose one character and wrote a description of that character using high level vocabulary and quality descriptive features. For the rest of this week we would like you to take on the role of this character and rewrite the opening three chapters of the story from their perspective. 'But my character isn't in the start of the story' I hear you scream! Well that's not a problem, this gives you a chance to use your imagination. So for example I will write as if I am telling the story from the perspective of Shere Khan. This is how I may choose to start my retelling;

One lazy morning I had just returned from a hunt when I heard a squealing and rustling in the bushes. My curiosity raised I decided to explore what lay beneath the lush green vines and bushes and to my horror discovered a crying crawling man cub! My anger raged through me so keen to claim him for my own I lunged forward. However, as my claws curled out of my paws and reached forward, I.....

So please select your character, re-read the first chapter of the story and retell that chapter from the perspective of your chosen character. Tomorrow you will be focussing on Chapter 2 and Friday Chapter 3 so please do not write beyond today's chapter.

Maths

Please read the attached problem carefully and think about which person matches which number. Rather than just match them up we would like you to explain how you worked out each one, what was your thought process?

Teddy says his number has the same amount of tens and as it does tenths. Therefore I looked through each number to see which matched. 46.2 has four tens but only 2 tenths so this can't be correct, 2.64 does not have any tens so this can't be right, 46.02 has 4 tens but no tenths so this can't be correct. 40.46 has 4 tens and 4 tenths so this must mean Teddy's number is 40.46.

Please match each number using the above style of explanation.

Challenge: Could you write your own problem in this style to challenge a parent or family member? Make sure you don't make it too obvious which number matches which person.
