

1 - Roll up some tin foil to make a simple 'branch' and tape it to a cardboard base.



2 - Cut a simple body and head shape from thin card.

3 - Cut slits in the shapes and pull together to make them more 3D . . .



then attach them just above the branch.

4 - Roll up 9 thin foil 'worms', then cut 3 in half so you've got 6 for the back legs and 6 for the smaller front legs.



5 - Tape these together and open the toes.

6 - Attach the front legs on . . . I've tucked the one behind the body to make it look more 3D.



7 - Now fix the back legs on, bend them to make them more realistic.



8 - Roll up more tin foil to make eyes, eyelids and a mouth.



9 - Now it's ready to paper maché, collage or paint.
