Please continue reading your private reading book and choose 4 new words you have read today. Write a definition of these words in your purple work book. Do you know any antonyms, synonyms or prefixes and suffixes that you could add? How would that change the meaning of the word?

Writing/English

Please write the 1st paragraph of your short story. Your story needs to begin with you setting the scene and writing a description of the Antarctic from Shackleton's ship. First look at the pictures below to help you to collect a list of key vocabulary. You could think about the 5 senses. What you can see, hear, touch, taste, and smell. Below is also an example from our text analysis last week to jog your memory of the structure. But remember you are writing about Shackleton's journey into the South Pole, this is just an example!

CGP Book: Page 7 – Place Value in Big Numbers. Please do this independently and at your own pace. Ask a grown up or older sibling to then look over your work using the answers which have been cut out of the book.

Extension challenge: Make up some 5 and 6 digit numbers and write them out in words and then write them out in partitioned number sentences. Remember the rules for writing in words – hyphens between 2-digit numbers, use 'and' between hundreds and tens (including between hundred and ten thousands)

e.g. 34295 – thirty-four thousand, two hundred and ninety-five

$$34295 = 30,000 + 4,000 + 200 + 90 + 5$$
