Reading

Read a book of your choice. It could be fiction (story) or non-fiction (information). Can you go on an 'adjective hunt' through the book? Remember, adjectives are words that describe. Can you record the adjectives that you find in your personal writing book? We wonder if you could improve the adjective, for example 'bad' could be improved to 'dreadful'.

Writing/English

Today, we are going to write the first version of our Arundel Castle leaflet.

Please write the draft version in your personal writing book. Later in the week, we will be transferring this onto a real leaflet template.

We would like you to include the following information:

1. A short introduction to entice the reader (this could include a question) - Would you like to go on an informative and historical trip for all the family? If so, Arundel Castle is the place for you.
2. Information about what you can see and do inside the castle - e.g. visit the armour room, explore the Great Hall, see the spooky dungeon, dress up as people who live in a castle (king, queen or knight).
3. Information about outside the castle - e.g. walk around the stunning gardens and greenhouses, see the waterfalls, have a picnic lunch.
4. Information about how to get to Arundel Castle and the location - E.g. It takes 90 minutes to get from London to Arundel, a car park is situated close to the castle, there is a nearby bus station and train station.

Remember to write persuasively, including interesting sentence starters and adjectives! 😊
