Write your own poem

Using what you have learnt from your isolation lessons, write your own counting poem.

If you are struggling, look at the two options below to help you:

Option 1 - Similar to *Five speckled frogs*

Answer these questions to help you plan your poem

- **What will your poem be called?**

(You could choose an animal from Australia and describe it using an adjective.)

- **What will they be doing?**

(Remember: the frogs were eating delicious bugs!)

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- **What will they do?**

(Remember: the frogs jumped into the pool.)

Option 2 - Similar to *Jenny and Spot*

Use this starter to get you going on your poem. You can start with 'five' rather than 'seven'.
