Edit your poem

Make sure you check your poem for spelling and punctuation.

Remember the first word of every line should have a capital letter and the end of verses should have capital letters.

It might be useful to ask an adult to check it for you – or if you have sent it to Miss Nicholls, she has probably given you some advice on an email that she has sent back to you.

Publish your poem

Write up your poem in neat. You may need to plan where each line will go. Use your best handwriting or type it up. Decorate your poem - use colours and pictures linked to what the poem is about. A border often helps a piece to look finished and published.

Investigating Homophones
