5. Write your incredibly, informative paragraph full of lots of juicy facts. Remember to include an opening sentence and a closing sentence. It should be no more than 2/3 of a page.

All great writers must proofread their work, look at each word that you have written, does it need a CAPITAL LETTER? Are there any full stops missing? Can you improve your spelling for 3 of your words?
