Reading

Find a book to read with your child. Look at the front cover, title and blurb and ask them what they think the story will be about and why? Read some of the book together and then talk to your child. Do they still think the same as they did before you opened the book? What do they think will happen next? Why?

Similar to Wednesday's activity (beat the detective), play this tricky word game with your child.

Cut some paper into rectangles and write these tricky words:

- We
- Me
- Be
- Are
- All
- My

Tell your child that all these words are tricky words (you can't sound them out, you just have to know them). Place the words on the floor or on a table across the room. Say one of the words and your child must run, read the word and bring the correct one back to you before you write the word. You could even do this outside! You could also use different tricky words if your child enjoys this game (see below for a list of tricky words phase 2 to 5).

Writing/English

Can you write about a person who helps us?

When we were at school, we talked about people who help us in our community and who to talk to if we need help. Currently, we are being helped by lots of different people. Can you draw a person who helps us and write about what they do?

E.g. 'People who work in supermarkets help us. They show us where to find our food and help us to buy our items at the till.'

Maths

Can you use positional language?

Take it in turns to give the other person instructions using positional language (e.g sit on the chair, stand in front of the table, lie under the bed, sit next to the sofa). You could also continue this activity in your child's play- at school we used a teddy bear. We placed the teddy in different places and used our language to describe what he was doing (e.g the teddy is sitting underneath the chair).
